The H1N1 flu vaccine is available to everyone, including York Region students and their families.

In order to prevent the spread of the H1N1 flu virus, everyone is being encouraged to get the vaccine. York Region Community and Health Services have opened the following five community immunization clinics where this vaccine is being offered:
