All: Lord, have mercy.

Leader: You asked for my life that you might work through me. I gave a small part that I might not get too involved. Christ, have mercy. **All: Christ, have mercy.**

Leader: Lord, forgive my calculated efforts to serve you only when it is convenient for me to do so, only in those places where it is safe to do so, with only those who make it easy to do so. Lord, forgive me, renew me, send me out as a usable instrument that I might take seriously the meaning of your cross.



All: Send me, O God, I am ready to be your listening presence, all the days of my life.

Leader: Open your eyes, open your ears, open your hearts. Listen to the cries of the people and strive to make a difference in their lives.

Reader 6: Loving God, through baptism you entrusted us with a mission to the entire world. You gave each one of us an individual mission, to serve you in others wherever we are.

Leader: We ask your blessing as we try to be your hands and feet, serving you each in our own way. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.
