Reader 5: We open our hearts to the coming of the Holy Spirit, who breathes into us renewing power in the service of God's new community, and leads us to live and work as one body for the good of all.

All: We joyfully believe that we are the church, called by God, sent forth by Christ, and led towards unity by the Holy Spirit, that the world may believe. We are called to be engaged in the ministry of reconciliation, that we may become a foretaste of God's new creation, where all things are made new.

Leader: Together we pray the words that Jesus gave to all Christians :

Our Father ...



Sending Forth

Reader 1: Loving God, who gives us the light of eternal life and love, enlighten us on our way, inflame us with courage and hope, inspire our thinking and doing.

Reader 2: In Christ, we have come to know that God's heart is open to us. Therefore, let us open our hearts to one another. The peace of Christ be with you.

All: Peace be with you. (All are invited to exchange a sign of pe ace)

Leader: God has given us a common calling. Let us go in peace to love and serve in Christ's name.

All: Amen.



For Martin Luther King, Oscar Romero and all who suffer for the sake of justice, let us bless the Lord:




For Elizabeth Fry, Mother Teresa, and all who serve the poor and homeless, let us bless the Lord:
