On October 15th and 24th, 2016, YCPIC hosted a Parent Workshop entitled, "Connected Parenting" at Father Bressani CHS in Woodbridge and Sacred Heart CHS in Newmarket respectively. Our guest speaker, Social Worker and Child/Family Therapist Jennifer Kolari, taught parents strategies for maintaining a solid relationship with children and fostering the posi-

tive influence that can sometimes be challenging. Both events were registered to capacity, and the parental feedback was stellar!

On November 1st, YCPIC hosted an Orientation Workshop at St. Theresa of Lisieux for 50 CSC parents representing a number of our schools throughout the Board. Information regarding CSC goals, Executive roles, PRO Grant submission, and running effective meetings was presented in order to support CSC members.

Parent engagement is a powerful factor in supporting student achievement. The focus of YCPIC is to support our Catholic School Councils in this endeavor, and to offer advice to the decision makers in our Board, all in the best interest of student success. Our YCPIC has committed to a number of initiatives to accomplish these goals this year.

The second half of this school year promises to be as informative and productive for YCPIC as the first. We will be planning our Annual Conference for the spring, utilizing funding from the Ministry of Education's Regional PRO Grant. As Director of Education, I am proud that York Catholic continues to be one of the top-ranked school boards in the province has earned the highest graduation rate of all English language Boards in Ontario. Key to the success of our Board is the high level of parent engagement in our schools.

Our schools invite parents and guardians to many events throughout the year including science fairs, literacy evenings, French cafés, Christmas concerts, Masses, Catholic Education Week events, guest speaker presentations, parent-teacher interviews, and so much more. ## Fr. Bressani CHS & Sacred Heart CSS

On October 15th and 24th, 2016, YCPIC had the opportunity of sponsoring two Jennifer Kolari workshops entitled, "Connected Parenting", to help parents learn a technique to manage difficult episodes in our children's lives. Jennifer Kolari's presentations were informative and humourous. She demonstrated the technique of mirroring as a

means to de-fuse a potentially troublesome situation in dealing with our children. Her technique is rooted in empathy and focusses on demonstrating understanding of the other person's feelings, in this case, our children.

Jennifer Kolari demonstrated the mirroring technique and broke it down into the CALM components as follows:

CONNECT – Give your undivided attention, using eye contact, body and voice to match the urgency of the message your child is trying to give you.

AFFECT - Make your response match the "affect" or outward display of emotions that your child is expressing.

LISTEN - <u>Really</u> listen. Paraphrase, clarify, summarize and wonder out loud to let your child know that you really have heard.

MIRROR – The above three components will result in mirroring, which creates a moment of deep connection between you and your child.

Each of the parents who attended one of the two workshops received a copy of one of Jennifer Kolari's books, which are entitled "Connected Parenting" and "You're Ruining My Life". These workshops were made possible by the Ministry of Education's Regional Parents Reaching Out Grant, and YCPIC graciously acknowledges its support.
