- Purchased texts and digital resources for the new Religious Education Curriculum for Grade 2 students, "Growing in Faith, Growing in Christ."
- · Initiated the Welcome Ambassador Retreat for established newcomers in Grades 6-7. The retreat provided students with training to enable them to become 'Welcome Ambassadors' to future newcomer students.
- Our Catholic schools participated in charitable activities:
 - \$142,238.46 for ShareLife.
 - \$45,112.80 for earthquake victims in Italy.
 - \$16,655 for humanitarian relief in Haiti following the damage caused by Hurricane Matthew.

Continuous Improvement of Student Achievement

- YCDSB achieved the highest Graduation Rate among all English-language school boards in the province.
- YCDSB students continued to outpace their provincial peers in EQAO and OSSLT. EQAO and OSSLT results are available on the Board website, www.ycdsb.ca.
- Implemented the Renewed Math Strategy, which included designating math leads for all elementary schools. Teachers and administrators participated in professional learning and were provided additional online math resources to support students and families.
- Continued our work with the First Nations, Métis and Inuit Policy Framework. Workshops and in-services were held for staff teaching Native Studies.

Effective Use of Our Resources

- This is a most challenging time for the Board as it works to implement strategies which will address our budget deficit. The creation of a Multi-Year Financial Recovery Plan will ensure prudent fiscal management with the least possible disruption to our classrooms and school communities. Provincial funding continues to decrease in areas where costs and needs are increasing, notably: Special Education and Excess Pupil Places due to declining enrollment. The Board continues to lobby the government with regards to inequitable funding as it relates to the impact of Provincially Negotiated Labour Agreements on our budget.
- Staffing reductions through retirements and attrition, staff restructuring, as well as program consolidations were approved this year to address budget constraints.
- Opened Pope Francis CES in Kleinburg.
- Ministry funding was secured for a new school site in Stouffville and a child care centre at Pope Francis CES. Additional child care spaces will be provided at St. Joseph the Worker CES and St. Rene Goupil-St. Luke CES.

Engaging Our Communities

- Parent workshops for students with Autism Spectrum Disorder.
- Together with the York Catholic Parent Involvement Committee the Board hosted successful parenting conferences: "Connected Parenting" and "Creating a Culture of Wellness in our Schools".
- Students starting high school who were new to Canada were invited to take part in the annual Newcomer Orientation Week Program.
- The Board approved the YCDSB Land Acknowledgement.

Student Voice

High school students and staff from across Ontario engaged in the three-day Ontario Catholic Student Leadership Conference in April entitled, Responding to the Call. The conference was designed to enhance students' leadership skills and provided opportunities for students to deepen their faith. 5,000 health kits were assembled for the homeless. The event concluded with a Mass at St. Michael's Cathedral.

Long Term Accommodation Plan (LTAP)

Year two of the Board's Long Term Accommodation Plan was implemented to assist with addressing the over 6,000 excess pupil spaces in schools. School closure decisions are among the most difficult for the Board of Trustees. This year, the Board made the very difficult decision to close three schools at the end of June 2017: Holy Family CES, St. Francis of Assisi CES and Our Lady of Peace CES. The Board also voted on the closures of St. Mother Teresa CES and St. Vincent de Paul CES for June 2018. Trustees extend a sincere thank you to the many stakeholders for their invaluable input throughout the consultation process, and to the parents and staff who participated on the Transition Committees for their dedication and commitment to ensuring a smooth transition for students to their new schools.

Secondary

- Secondary school offices open on Monday, August 21, 2017.
- Grade 9 Orientation Day is Tuesday, September 5, 2017 (Grade 7 for Our Lady of the Lake CCS).
- The first day of school for students in Grades 10-12 is Wednesday, September 6, 2017 (Grades 8-12 for Our Lady of the Lake CCS).
