Kind and loving Jesus, we see your sacrifice.

Strengthen our hearts to be compassionate to all those we meet, giving of ourselves.

Gentle Jesus, your dying on the cross was cruel.

Give us hearts of justice to stand for others as Mary stood at the foot of your cross. Amen.

We close in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Holy Saturday: April 11th


We begin our prayer in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**
