

## As We Prepare for the Upcoming Year

Spring has finally arrived, and we welcome the warm weather and bright sunshine. And while we have barely had the opportunity to enjoy the spring weather, we have already started planning and preparing for the new school year ahead. As part of the process, we look at the organization of our school, including class organization.

In efforts to assist us in the school organization for 2019-2020, we ask that you kindly inform the school if you are moving out of the area or planning not to return to St. Mary of the Angels by sending written confirmation and contacting the school office and informing Ms. Tamburini and Ms. Santino at 289-304-0719.

As we begin the process of class organization for the next year, please appreciate the fact that in creating class lists there is a careful process whereby teaching teams, support staff, and administration take into consideration various factors.

In creating the best possible groupings of students much time, thought, consideration and careful planning is involved. Our goal is to establish well-balanced classrooms. We wish to group students together so that they enhance one another's learning experience.

Should there be a split class created, please note that we do consider those students who have never been in a split class before as well as, individual special needs and learning styles.

Careful consideration is given to the following when forming class lists:

- Student learning styles
- Gender balance (male/female)
- Balanced academic abilities within each class
- Social, emotional and physical needs of students
- Student experience in combined class
- Behavioural needs
- Special Education/ESL needs
- General dynamics within the class
- A balance of maturity levels

Should you wish to share additional considerations in addition to those stated above, please write a letter <u>only</u> to the attention of Mrs. Scenna by <u>May 10th</u>. Please note that <u>specific teacher requests will not be considered</u> and should therefore not be included in the letter. In addition, we ask that <u>you not include any other students' names in your requests as well.</u>

Please remember that the final decision for student placement and school organization remains the responsibility of the school principal. We thank you for your cooperation and support.

#### **EOAO**

The weeks of May 21<sup>st</sup> to June 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2019, our Primary and Junior Division EQAO testing will take place. Our grade 3 and 6 students will continue in their preparation for the testing in a variety of ways, intertwined with ongoing classroom delivery of the curriculum. While standardized testing certainly has its merits, EQAO represents one valuable piece of data in the ongoing assessment of student achievement.

The best way to help prepare your children is to support them in regular review of concepts taught throughout the year. A reminder that it is very important that <u>students are present</u> when the tests are being administered and that there are no disruptions to their school day. <u>Please ensure that doctor and dental appointments are scheduled after school hours during this time period.</u>

#### Luke 4:18 Global Initiative for 2019

As part of St. Mary of the Angels Me to We Global initiative, the Luke 4:18 committee is dedicating this year to raising funds for The Samaritan Foundation.

#### The problem:

After devastating earthquakes hit Haiti on January 12th, 2010, many Haitian families were left homeless and were forced to migrate east to the Dominican Republic in hopes of a more prosperous life. Unfortunately, because of political tensions between the two countries, homeless Haitian families that made it to the D.R were not welcomed with open arms and did not receive any financial support from the Dominican government. They were essentially seen as squatters on D.R land and remained poverty-stricken.

Coupled with the many homeless Dominican families, there are thousands of people living in unsanitary wooden shacks without any running water, daily food or income, unsure of what the next day might hold for the livelihood of their family.

#### Here is what they are living through:





#### The solution:

Over the last 25 years, The Samaritan Foundation has been working alongside the poorest people in the Dominican Republic to provide shelter and an escape from the cycle of poverty to give families the gift of a better life.

The projects they've completed include homes, schools, clinics and complete villages. So far, through the generosity of their supporters, they have built 14 villages representing over 1500 homes, 12 churches, 8 schools, 5 clinics, 4 playgrounds, 3 vocational schools, and 6 sports facilities.

#### Take a look below at some of the work they've done so far:



#### Our goal:

As our focus for the **Me to We Global initiative**, we will be raising funds for a beautiful brick and mortar home, with running water and plumbing for \$6500.00 Canadian dollars, built by the Samaritan Foundation within one of the residential communities they are developing. Once complete, these homes are donated to the homeless families that apply for the homes through the foundation.

With money raised and donated, we can provide shelter and a completely new life for an entire family for generations to come. Not only that, it will give their children the ability to have education and grow up with opportunities they would have never had otherwise.

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Christ is risen, alleluia!

On this, the solemnity of solemnities, I want to take the opportunity to wish you and your children a very happy and blessed Easter! The Resurrection is the fulfilment of our Saviour's promise of salvation and the Easter season is a time when we take a moment to celebrate the gift of our redemption with our families. It is also a time of great celebration in our schools, that coincides with the arrival of spring and new beginnings.

Holy Week, which has led us to this glorious moment, is the most solemn and holy period in our liturgical year. It is an opportunity for us to pause and enter into the Paschal Mystery by uniting our own suffering with that of Christ. These days are a period of particular importance in our schools as our students are given the opportunity to reflect on their life of faith. Our Lord's entrance into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday signifies the beginning of our liturgical celebration of the Paschal Mystery, where we consider His coming Passion, Death, and Resurrection during the Triduum.

Holy Thursday, the first day of the Triduum, reminds us of the celebration of the Last Supper and the institution of the Eucharist, which is the source and summit of our faith. Good Friday marks Christ's sacrifice of His life as well as our humble acknowledgement that God himself paid the ultimate price for our salvation. Holy Saturday begins in sorrowful silence but culminates in our joyful celebration of Christ's victory over death in the Easter Vigil, particularly at the beautiful moment where we welcome catechumens into the Church through Baptism and share with them the redemption won for us by Christ.

This rich spiritual experience of the Paschal Mystery that we celebrate in our schools, ultimately reminds us of who we are as followers of Christ and members of Catholic school communities. It is the central moment in our life of faith, especially as we are reminded that we are sons and daughters of God through the great mystery of our redemption.

May the glory of Christ's Resurrection be a moment of joy and peace in your lives and those of your children this Easter.
