Punctuality is a Life Skill

Punctuality is a life skill which is learned at an early age. Help your child acquire this skill by arriving at school daily between 8:15-8:25 a.m. In doing so, your child is able to relax, play and socialize with peers prior to entering the school with his/her classmates. As a reminder, all students who do not enter the school with their class lines should enter through the <u>front doors</u> and will be marked late. <u>There is still an overwhelming amount of students arriving late and you are encouraged to arrive before the morning bell.</u> Thank you for your co-operation. After the bell rings, all students should enter through the <u>front doors only.</u>

Colder Weather

Winter is around the corner! With that in mind, please remember to dress children appropriately for the colder weather. Hats, gloves, scarfs and boots will keep your child (ren) warm during recess. It is also important to have an extra pair of clothes (socks, pants) for your children should they get wet. York Catholic School Board Extreme Weather Policy states:

- At the beginning of each school year, administrators, in collaboration with their Catholic School Councils, will determine the extreme cold weather temperature. This temperature with wind chill, shall be no warmer than -15 degrees Celsius and no colder than -20 degrees Celsius.
- The agreed upon extreme cold weather temperature is final and shall remain in effect for the entire school year.
- The extreme cold weather temperature shall be reviewed with the Catholic School Council annually.

Administration, together with the 2019- 2020 Catholic School Council have determined that students will remain outdoors for recess when the weather is -16C or warmer. Students will remain indoors for all recesses if the weather is colder than -16C.

In the event of inclement weather and bus cancellation the school will remain open, unless it is otherwise reported on the radio/television stations listed below. If buses are cancelled in the morning they will not run in the afternoon. Be sure to listen for updates about York Catholic District School Board. Hour of Code

During the Week of Code (December 9-13) Grade 4-6 students will be introduced to the basics of computer science by participating in **Hour of Code**. Lead by the librarian and teachers, students will choose from a number of tutorials that introduce them to computer science and programming in a way that is relevant, engaging and fun! The focus is on creativity and imagination. Students will be able to use computers as designers and creators. The goal is that students are able to understand and create dynamic, interactive media similar to that which they see and use every day with their computer games and apps.

Student Learning

Hour of Code and creative computing introduces students to basic programming concepts such as repeat-loops, conditions, and simple algorithms in a fun and engaging way. Creative computing can certainly generate an interest in computer science and programming, but the learning goes beyond this; students develop skills that are essential and transferable, such as the ability to,

- reason systematically
- sequence
- problem solve and persevere
- think critically

- work collaboratively
- express ideas using media
- become fluent using technology
