RE: Final Transition: New Playground Boundaries

Good Afternoon Parents/Guardians,

On *Monday January 13th, 2020* we will complete the final transition of our classroom move. Now that our kindergartens are back in their classrooms and our Grade 1s are back on the main floor of the school, we will now transition back to our original playgrounds and drop off/pick up areas. Please see the map attached for a visual and some key points below to help explain the changes:

- Kindergarten students will use their permanent fenced kindergarten playground (East side) as both drop off and pick up locations. Students will also use this space for their outdoor play.
- The temporary fenced area (West area) that was used for the kindergarten students will be removed in the coming weeks.
- The primary playground will be on the East side. Students (Grades 1-3) will enter and also be dismissed through the middle doors (see map).
- Our Grade 7s have also moved classrooms in order to have our intermediate division together, as well as, relieve congestion in East hallway.
- Grades 4, 7 and 8 now line up in the West playground (see map).
- A gentle reminder that the East parking lot is to be used as a "Kiss and Ride" loop, we discourage parking in this area as it is our school bus/school vehicle zone. When entering this loop please continue to pull in parallel to the sidewalk and drop off your child(ren) and safely exit the loop.
- Parents that wish to walk their child(ren) to the primary yard or kindergarten gate are encouraged to park their vehicles in the West parking lot and walk over to the primary and kindergarten areas using the walkway at the front of the building.
- Parents/guardians please continue to stay along the fenced areas after dropping off your child(ren) and please do not enter the playground.
