INFORMED CONSENT/PERMISSION FORM FOR SKI/SNOWBOARD EXCURSIONS

St. Nicholas CES is arranging a trip for pupils to go to Snow Valley Ski Resort to ski (snowboard/snowblade/ other). This signed form is required for all pupils who wish to participate in this outdoor recreation and snow sport education program. It should be understood that the purpose of this excursion is educational. Lessons are mandatory.			
INHERENT RISK			
Skiing/Snowboarding/other is a sport with physical demands and inherent risks, which are beyond the control of Snow Valley Ski Resortand the York Catholic District School Board. Falls, collisions and other incidents may occur which result in serious injury or death. Participants must assume the inherent risks of the sport.			
Following all rules and procedures can reduce the risk of injury. Failure to follow rules will result in the pupil losing their lift ticket and future resort privileges.			
EQUIPMENT			
Snow Valley Ski Resortprovides rental equipment. Bindings on equipment reduce the risk of injury when falling.
