LAND ACKNOWLEGEMENT



Georgina, East Gwillimbury, Newmarket is having fast population growth as many new development will be completed in near futures, however, for YCDSB, but the only elementary school for giftedness is cancelled. The students in those area could over 1 hour commute, or may have to give up the choice of registering PACE. Or they may decide to change school board due to proximity. There are still 2 High schools with AP for Newmarket, without an elementary school in York Region North, there can be a chance for fewer students feeding to those schools' AP Program? Would the school board consider reopening/relocating at least one Gifted program in YR North, given the fast demographic change in coming years?

The notion of "advantaged" students is concerning, and does the administrator share the same concern? or just the large social setting made us to wonder?

- Star Program is made mandatory for all APTs and one CRT in the schools that do not have APT. There are 97 teachers trained.
- Special Education Consultants received STAR training in order to enable them to supporting teachers with the implementation.
- Two Year Training plan for EAs and SEIs in elementary panel will start on November 17, 2023.
