11. DISCUSSION/INFORMATION ITEMS:

a) Participation Data for the International Language Extended Day Program

A. Arcadi, Superintendent of Curriculum & Assessment presented revised information about the participation data for the International Language Extended Day Program by school for the 2022-2023 school year. Mr. Arcadi reported that there are 181 students who were exempted while 5,723 students are active participants in the ILI program. This updated data stemmed from report card information. Trustees requested a breakdown of the schools that the 181 students attended as well as checking if these students are enrolled in continuing education classes on Tues/Thursday or Saturday program.

b) International Languages Financial Update

C. McNeil, Chief Financial Officer and Treasurer of the Board provided an Executive Summary of the ILI Program and background funding information indicating the program is running an approximate deficit of \$3-400K. Mr. McNeil advised that at the May 10, 2022 meeting, the International Language Extended Day Program Committee agreed that for 2022-23 to maintain the International Language Extended Day Program status quo and explore funding for the 2023-2024 school year.

Board Vice-Chair Iafrate asked that a survey be conducted to determine why students are being exempted and to determine interest in the program.

It was noted that if there are investors who wish to donate towards the International Language Extended Day Program that they be directed to contact Domenic Scuglia, Director of Education, who together with the Finance Department would draw up a legal contract. A few Trustees expressed their concerns with this program in regards to being equitable as to why we are funding it for one geographical area and not funding other programs, eg, special education. Being fiscally responsible is the main concern.

The International Language Extended Day Program agreed that languages are very important and the only reason we have not expanded this program is due to financial constraints. More work needs to be done to maintain values, to keep it alive and thriving in our schools.

Executive Summary

- International Language Extended Day Program (Elementary) is taught at 21 schools to students of all descents where Italian Language is taught during the school day which is extended by 20 minutes.
- The Program is funded through the GSN Continuing Education grant and was previously also funded by Centro Scuola. Without Centro Scuola support, the program creates a budget pressure.
- 2023/24 Ministry funding for International Languages is \$60.68 per instructional hour where the class size is 23. Where the average class size is less than 23, funding is reduced by \$1 for each instructional hour.
- An alternative to the Extended Day Program is an after hours language program which is also funded by the Continuing Education International Languages grant.



Program Details

YCDSB has recognized the importance of educational experiences involving International Languages since the early 1980's and offers Italian International Language during the school day, evenings, Saturdays and during the summer. The International Language Elementary (ILE) Extended Day Italian program gives students in Grades 1 to Grade 8 the opportunity to learn the Italian language and culture during the instructional school day. This program extends the school day by 20 minutes and students receive instruction for an average of 100 minutes per week. Currently, twenty-one different school sites offer the Italian ILE Extended Day program. The school sites are:

Draft Ministry Funding Request

The intent of this letter is to request additional funding to support the International Language Extended Day Program at York Catholic School Board.

YCDSB has recognized the importance of educational experiences involving International Languages since the early 1980's and offers Italian International Language during the school day, evenings, Saturdays and during the summer.

The International Language Elementary (ILE) Extended Day Italian program gives students in Grades 1 to Grade 8 the opportunity to learn the Italian language and culture during the instructional school day. This program extends the school day by 20 minutes and students receive instruction for an average of 100 minutes per week. Currently, twenty-one different school sites offer the Italian ILE Extended Day program.

The Program is funded through the GSN Continuing Education grant and, until recently, was also funded by Centro Scuola. Without Centro Scuola support, the program incurs a funding deficit of approximately \$0.3-0.4M per year, depending on enrollment levels, staff supply costs, and class sizes.

Due to a number of factors, the York Catholic District School Board is facing significant budget pressures, and as such, programs which create budget pressures are being closely evaluated.

In order to sustain the International Language Extended Day Program (Elementary), the Board is requesting \$0.4M, on an annual basis, to cover the funding shortfall. Please refer to the attached Appendix which shows the program's costs from a recent Ad-hoc International Language Extended Day Program Committee meeting.

We appreciate your support on this matter.
