## **Tamil Heritage Month Pongal Celebration**

On January 29, 2023 at the invitation of Rukshan Para of the Federation of Tamil Canadians, I attended a Thai Pongal Festival.

As Rukshan explained it: "Thai Pongal is the Tamil equivalent of Canadian Thanksgiving. This is a time where Tamils around the world celebrate nature's abundance and blessings given to all of us in the form of food, health and life in general. This celebration promotes the values of sharing, generosity and goodwill through the exchange of gifts and wishes."

Through song, dance, yoga, poetry and cultural attire, the richness of Tamil culture was on full display. The entire event was organized by Tamil youth, who displayed a high level of organizational and execution skills. Not only that, their purpose and commitment to help young people learn about and develop an appreciation for their culture was truly remarkable. In addition to their dedication to the young generation, they are also committed to serving seniors, thereby bridging the gap between generations. It was a welcoming, joyous and colorful celebration. My thanks to Rukshan for inviting me and helping me to appreciate the richness of the Tamil culture, and the tremendous contribution Tamils are making to our community.

## **Our Voice Black Leadership Conference**

On February 7, 2023 I attended the Our Voice Conference, hosted by the always engaging and energetic Mr. Chad Garel, VP & Department of the Conference of Black Students. We continued to work towards many of the objectives in our Multi-Year Strategic Plan and hosted many Board events and workshops for our students and staff. February was Black Heritage Month, and it gave us an additional platform to highlight and celebrate the tremendous contributions that Canadians of African ancestry have made in our communities, our country and the world. It also reminds us all that we all need to continue to work hard to break down structural barriers. This work is sadly far from finished so let our focus as a Catholic community always be to love thy neighbour as thyself.

February 20 was Family Day and I truly hope you enjoyed a beautiful long weekend and were blessed to spend time with people you love. Lastly, February 22 was Ash Wednesday, which marks the beginning of Lent. As we journey together through Lent this year, may we choose to live whole-heartedly with Christ on our way to the Cross.

### **Our Voice Conference**

On February 7, our board hosted a Black Heritage Month conference for students, called "Our Voice." The conference was led by Chad Garel, Vice Principal at St. Joan of Arc CHS and York Catholic DSB Black Graduation Coach. The students and leadership team had an abundance of energy. Everyone enjoyed presentations from inspirational guest speakers, a scavenger hunt, art exhibit and group workshops. Throughout the day, the leaders and guests were treated to wonderful steel drum performances, a delicious catered lunch and everyone wore their new T-shirt which proudly quoted the inspirational Harriet Tubman. I was very impressed by the incredible leadership and enthusiasm displayed by everyone. "Every great dream begins with a dreamer. ### **OECTA ABR Lecture**

On February 9, OECTA hosted a lecture for YCDSB staff with the aim of eradicating Anti-Black Racism in education. Our Board offices saw approximately 100 committed teachers and staff anxious to learn more about how they can dismantle systematic barriers that are still present in our schools and communities. The morning lecture was presented by KOJO Institute and was part of a training program that consisted of two virtual after-school sessions and a full-day in-person session.

### St. Augustine's Art Show was a huge success!

On February 1, (after two weather-related postponements) the St. Augustine CHS Art Department was finally able to host their semester-end art show – they did not disappoint! Over 300 people were in attendance. The show included work representing all areas of the Art Department, including drama, music, tech and fine arts. Everyone was treated to light refreshments, treats and a Vincent van Gogh inspired cake.

### **Twitter Break**

On February 2, we filmed the latest edition of "Twitter Break" at one of our fanatic Full Day Kindergarten (FDK) classrooms. It was a breath of fresh air being around all those energetic, young minds. We conducted interviews with the wonderful teacher, DECE and some of the students. The full video is now up on our website on the kindergarten webpage and our Board's main webpage.

### **OYAP Signing Day**

Signing Day for OYAP students took place on February 16. It was a celebration and information session for new apprentices starting their journey in the skilled trades. This particular group of apprentices are entering our highly competitive Accelerated OYAP program where they will have an opportunity to attend a college or training delivery agency to challenge their Level 1/Basic Training. We had over 80 students in attendance in this joint effort between YRDSB and ourselves. The students had time to connect with Employment Ontario offices from across York Region, the Workforce Planning Board of York Region, and the Ministry of Labour, Immigration, Training, and Skills Development.

## **New FDK Video**

Our Marketing and Communications team, with the help of the Curriculum Department, also visited two FDK classrooms to film more dynamic students and their fantastic education teams. We created two new videos showcasing our play-based learning FDK program. The first video takes place from a student's perspective, and the second is based on our educator's perspective of the program. The full videos will be available soon.

## **Good News Stories from Principals**

This year ShareLife week will be held on March 27-31. Every school has been sent a Toolkit to help them carry out the week's campaign in their community. The Toolkit includes ideas on themed activities, presentation links and short videos to show the students. Each school has the option to decide which activities they wish to run. As always, we commit to 100% of our schools participating in this campaign that helps us live our Gospel mission. Last year, we raised over \$151,000 between our schools and employees' campaign.

The International Education department has completed and posted a new International Ed video online. We feel the theme, "I am York Catholic," is a powerful message to send to anyone wishing to participate in our programs and join our YCDSB family. ## **Board Overview**

- The York Catholic District School Board (YCDSB) provides Catholic educational programming to approximately 51,000 students in Kindergarten through Grade 12, as well as general interest and language courses for the public through its Continuing Education Department.
- YCDSB is consistently ranked as one of the top-performing school boards in the province of Ontario. It is governed by 10 publicly-elected trustees and has over 8,000 staff, making it one of the region's largest employers.

## **2022 MYSP Survey Highlights**







Histogram of Student Achievement: On a scale from 1–5, please indicate your satisfaction with how the YCDSB supports "Continuous Improvement of Student Achievement".





Histogram of Exceptional Learners: On a scale of 1-5, please indicate your satisfaction with how the YCDSB supports exceptional learners to meet their full potential.



Histogram of Equity and Diversity: On a scale from 1–5, please indicate your satisfaction with the YCDSB's equity and diversity strategies.






Histogram of Student Well-Being: On a scale from 1-5, please indicate your satisfaction with the YCDSB Mental Health and Student Well-Being strategies.










#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The intent of this report is to respond to Notice of Motion from the December 2022 Board meeting regarding the enrolment cap at Pope Francis CES. The report proposes an increase to the JK cap and introduces a process to permit admission of SK-8 students who reside within the Pope Francis attendance area should there be space available within the existing class structure.

#### NOTICE OF MOTION

At the December Board meeting, Trustees passed the following motions:

**THAT** staff review the implementation of the Pope Francis CES cap on SK-8 to see if there are opportunities for families to attend Pope Francis CES if spaces open up, such as families moving out of the school boundaries.

**THAT** staff review the school layout to see if the JK cap can be raised without compromising student safety

**THAT** a report comes to the February Regular Board Meeting so that possible changes can be implemented for the 2023-24 school year.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Pope Francis CES opened in 2016 and is currently operating over its capacity. Consistent with the Board approved Long Term Accommodation Plan, Administration conducted a boundary review in January/February 2022 to look at various options to address the enrolment pressures at the school. A virtual Public Information Session was held on February 1, 2022 to present options to the community and to seek feedback.

On February 22, 2022 the Board of Trustees approved Option 5, which redirected future development areas, placed an enrolment cap on all new students to Pope Francis from (SK-Grade 8), and limited the number of JK registrations to 90 students/year. Students redirected from Pope Francis are accepted with transportation provided, at St. Stephen CES.

The final report from the boundary review presented at the February 22, 2022 Board meeting included the following explanation from the Local Boundary Review Committee regarding the recommended Option 5:

The recommended option minimizes disruption to the existing Pope Francis students and families and proposes to relocate any new families to alternative schools. This option recognizes the potential impact of the new public school in 2024 and minimizes changes to existing families and students. The priority given to Area A in the lottery process recognizes the proximity of this area to the school and the implication of transporting students who may otherwise not require transportation.

An analysis of enrolment data as of October 31, 2022 identifies that there are 50 students that live within the Pope Francis attendance area, currently enrolled at St. Stephen. Table 1 below includes totals by grade and boundary study area.

#### **CURRENT SITUATION**

As of October 31, 2022 enrolment at Pope Francis is 800. With a capacity of 602 pupil places the school is operating at 133% utilization. There are 10 portables on site, which is the maximum permitted per the approved site plan. As directed by the Board, in November 2022 Administration submitted a request to the Ministry of Education for funding to replace the 10 portable units with a 10 classroom port-a-pak. Given current assumptions, 10 portables are expected to be sufficient for the projected peak enrolment of the school, although the school will continue to experience operational pressures due to the number of students on site, including: limited outdoor playspace, challenges with outdoor supervision/sitelines, scheduling adequate gym time for all classes, on and off site traffic management during arrival and dismissal.

Any change to the currently approved site plan (10 portables), will require investigation (scope) by the Board's civil consultant, City of Vaughan site plan approval and will add to the existing operational pressures at the school.

#### 2022 Enrolment Cap Implementation - Review

#### SK - Grade 8 Cap

The SK - Grade 8 cap implemented last year restricted the registration of any students to Pope Francis CES other than JK students, with JK students limited to 90 for the 2022/23 school year. Students unable to attend Pope Francis in SK-Grade 8 are accepted with transportation provided to St. Stephen CES.

In reviewing the enrolment as of October 31, 2022, a number of vacancies have developed within the current SK to 8 class structures. This presents an opportunity to consider creating a secondary entrance point for SK - Grade 8 students within the existing class structures, thereby not requiring any additional classrooms.

#### **School Layout - Review**

The design of Pope Francis CES provides the school with 6 purpose built kindergarten classrooms, which include specific equipment and access to the kindergarten play yard. A 7th kindergarten class is currently housed in a regular classroom. In reviewing the situation, it has been determined that the arrangement of a 7th classroom is sustainable providing the class be limited to a lower overall class size, than that of a class housed in a purpose built classroom. Given this assessment there is an opportunity to consider a slightly larger cap than the previous 90 JK students.

#### **OPPORTUNITIES**

In response to the Notice of Motion and to address requests from families who have been impacted by the change, Administration is proposing the following measures for the Board's consideration that acknowledges the limit of 10 portables permitted as per the currently approved site plan.

#### Increase to the JK CAP from 90 students to 101 students.

The proposed increase is reflective of the current room allocation at Pope Francis. The school is currently utilizing 6 purpose built kindergarten rooms (30 students each). In addition to the purpose built kindergarten rooms, the school is utilizing a smaller, regular sized classroom for Kindergarten instruction. This room is able to accommodate a smaller number of students (22 students) than a purpose built kindergarten room.

The proposed new JK enrolment cap has been calculated as follows:

**Total Kindergarten Spaces = 202** (101 Junior Kindergarten / 101 Senior Kindergarten)

Implement a process to permit additional students (SK-Grade 8) to attend Pope Francis from the approved attendance area

The review of the existing SK -Grade 8 cap has identified an opportunity to fill in year vacancies within these grades without exceeding the original overall enrolment projections provided in the original boundary report. The basic concept is that students interested in joining an SK to 8 class at Pope Francis CES would be placed on a wait list, and accepted at prescribed times as space becomes available.

The following is a summary of the intended steps:

- 1. Following the release of the preliminary class structure for the next school year, Administration will determine the number of vacant spaces in each class with consideration to Ministry of Education compliance requirements and the Board's collective agreement obligations with regards to class sizes
- 2. Families of students who have been redirected to St. Stephen CES due to the enrolment cap will be invited to submit their child's name for inclusion on a waitlist for any available spaces that may be identified following #1 above.
- 3. For the 2023/24 school year, a cutoff date of Monday March 27, 2023 is established for families to submit their child's name.
- 4. An SK-Grade 8 Selection Process will be held to establish an 'SK-Grade 8 Wait List'. Consistent with the priority rankings for the JK lottery, the 'SK-Grade 8 Wait List' will be determined with the following priority and in the following order:
- a. SK-Grade 8 students with existing siblings attending Pope Francis from:
  - 1) Area A; then
  - 2) Area B; then
  - 3) Area C
- b) SK-Grade 8 students without existing siblings in the school from:
  - 1) Area A; then
  - 2) Area B; then
  - 3) Area C
- 5. Administration and the Pope Francis CES administrative team will fill any vacant spaces in each class where available with students from the waitlist for placement. This process will commence following the completion of the lottery and will continue until September 30 of that school year.
- 6. Any students who register at the school following the cut off dates identified in #3 above will be added to the waitlist, and prioritized per #4 above and then by date the application was received.

Registration Deadline for JK Lottery - March 1st (per Board motion of February 22, 2022)

Deadline for entry to the SK-8 Selection Process - March 27, 2023

Preliminary Class Structure for Pope Francis for 2023/24 - March 31, 2023

SK-Grade 8 Selection Process - Thursday April 13, 2023

Lottery Results and Offer to Waitlist Notification to Families - April 20, 2023

Admittance from Waitlist - to commence April 20, 2023 and ongoing up to September 30, 2023

#### **ANALYSIS**

The changes proposed to the enrolment cap at Pope Francis CES offer a balanced approach to providing additional families to attend Pope Francis, while attempting to minimize long term enrolment pressures at the school.

By increasing the JK enrolment cap from 90 to 101, 11 additional JK students will be able to enrol at Pope Francis for the 2023/24 school year. By introducing a wait list for SK - Grade 8 students, an opportunity to transfer to Pope Francis in the future should a space become available.

#### **SUMMARY**

Administration has proposed modifications to the enrolment cap at Pope Francis CES in response to a Trustee Notice of Motion. The changes proposed within this report are intended to provide a greater number of families to attend Pope Francis while ensuring appropriate accommodation for all students.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

**THAT** For the 2023/24 school year, Junior Kindergarten registrations at Pope Francis will be increased from 90 to 101.

**THAT** the SK to 8 enrolment cap at Pope Francis CIS be amended to accept new students from SK-8 as outlined in Steps 1 to 6 identified in this report.

**THAT** Administration report back to the Board in February 2024 regarding any proposed changes to the enrolment cap prior to the 2024/25 school year






### **Advanced Placement Program at YCDSB**



YCDSB is proud to receive the *AP District Honour Roll Award* from the College Board US for expanding opportunity and continuously improving overall academic performance for AP students across the 8 AP high schools. This award recognizes YCDSB as the top performing board in Ontario, alongside only one other board in the province. YCDSB AP students demonstrated this academic excellence in the May 2022 College Board AP Exam session. The following exam results illustrate how YCDSB AP students compared to their peers in Ontario and across the globe.





#### **Additional YCDSB AP Data**

8 YCDSB secondary schools offer the AP-Preparatory (grades 9-11) and the AP Program (grade 12).

4 schools offer AP as the Gifted Program platform, 4 schools offer AP as a Regional Program.

Approximately 1300 students from grades 9-12 are currently enrolled in the AP-Preparatory and AP Program

30% of the students enrolled in AP are Gifted, and the remaining 70% are students non-Gifted.

20 AP courses are offered across 4 disciplines from grades 9-12: English, Math Science, and Canadian and World Studies.

### **Upcoming YCDSB Initiatives for AP**

In an ongoing effort to enhance our existing AP Program to increase enrollment, retention and student achievement, *AP Capstone* will be piloted at Our Lady Queen of the World Catholic Academy in September 2023. AP Capstone is an innovative new program from the U.S.College Board that uses an inquiry framework to equip students with the independent research, collaborative teamwork, and communication skills that are increasingly valued by universities. For more information, please refer to the <u>AP Capstone Guide</u>.

A new *AP Statistics* course linked to the gr.12 Data Management course (MDM4UY) will be piloted at Father Bressani in September 2023. This will be the first AP Statistics course offered in Ontario.

All senior level AP courses will be offered as eLearn courses along with the in-person course offerings as of September 2023.

#### **Executive Summary:**

The purpose of this report is to provide Trustees a summary of Transportation Exemptions approved by the Director for the 2022/23 school year. This is the second semi-annual report for the year as required by Student Transportation Services Policy 203.

#### **Background Information:**

Eligibility requirements for transportation are identified within Student Transportation Services Policy 203. These eligibility requirements include distance criteria, program exceptions, medical exceptions etc. In addition, the policy recognizes that from time to time there may be extenuating circumstances where transportation may be approved by the Director of Education on compassionate grounds. These exceptions are to be reported to the Board on a semi-annual basis.

The following table is a summary of Transportation Exceptions for the 2022/23 school year, as of February 2023.

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#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The purpose of this report is to provide Trustees with a summary of major development applications received during the period of June 2022 – January 2023.

The report includes a summary of new development applications exceeding 100 low density and 250 high density units, as well as reporting of all development within Urban Growth Centres. In addition, the report highlights Administration's involvement in various land use planning processes such as secondary plans, block and precinct plans and other land use studies undertaken from June 2022 – January 2023. The report also includes a brief description of Minister's Zoning Orders (MZOs) and Enhanced Minister's Zoning Orders (eMZOs). There have been no residential MZOs issued by the province for this reporting period.

Of the 140 new development applications received since the last report of June 2022, 26 development applications meet the threshold for inclusion in this report. A summary of the development applications received and a map identifying their location are included as appendices to this report.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The semi-annual development report was established in 2009 with the intent of informing the Board of significant development activity within York Region. The report includes all low/medium density applications proposing 100 units or more, and any high density applications proposing 250 units or more (Table 1 and Map 1).

In an effort to provide increased transparency, Administration has included three additional summaries: Table 2 includes information specific to all development within the Urban Growth Centres regardless of the number of units proposed; Table 3 summarizes other land use studies which have been active over the past 6 months; and Table 4 summarizes current MZOs and eMZOs.

Official plans, secondary plans and block plans with a site designation will continue to come to the Board individually as they are received.

#### DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITY FROM JUNE 2022 TO JANUARY 2023

Of the 140 new development applications received since the last report of June 2022, 26 plans meet the established thresholds for inclusion in the Semi-Annual Development Report (Table 1). None of the remaining 114 applications were located within an Urban Growth Centre (Table 2).

#### HIGH DENSITY DEVELOPMENT ALONG THE STEELES AVENUE CORRIDOR (TORONTO)

High density development along Yonge Street corridor, south of Steeles Avenue in the City of Toronto is projected to result in sizable growth from the Yonge North Subway extension. Administration will monitor this development to assess possible impacts north of Steeles Avenue.

#### OTHER LAND USE PLANNING STUDIES

Administration continues to be involved in a number of other land use planning activities and studies including secondary plans, block plans, Ontario Land Tribunal (OLT) matters, and other land use studies over the June 2022 – January 2023 reporting period. Table 3 provides a summary of the broader land use planning exercises that Administration has participated in during this time period. Administration will continue to participate in these studies and provide the Board with further updates as required. No action from the Board is required at this time.

As a supplement to the information provided in Table 3, additional details regarding 2 specific areas of interest are included below.

#### Block 55 Northwest (Copper Creek / Kleinburg CHS)

The Board designated a secondary school site within Block 55NW in May 2019 as part of Amendments 47 and 48 of the City of Vaughan's Official Plan and Board staff continue to monitor and participate in the progression of the Block 55NW Block Plan. In October 2022, four individual Draft Plans of Subdivision and Zoning Bylaw Amendment Applications encompassing the Block 55NW Block Plan were circulated for review and comment. The 4 development applications were processed at the December 20, 2022 Board meeting.

Phase 1 and 2 meet the established thresholds for inclusion in this report and are identified on Map 1 as No. 13 and 14. Phases 3 and 4 of the development do not meet the thresholds and as such, are not listed in (Table 1).

The local municipal councillor and landowner have objected to a secondary school site at this location.

#### Secondary School Site Opportunity (Nobleton)

As identified on Map 1 (No. 17), King Township has circulated a plan of subdivision in southeast Nobleton to the Board for review and comment. Given the objections from the developer in Block 55 northwest (Copper Creek) regarding the Board's designation of a secondary school site on the Copper Creek lands, Administration has inquired with the Township of King regarding the opportunity of a secondary school site in southeast King Township. King Township staff recently met with the developer to introduce the concept of a secondary school site and have requested written comments from YCDSB staff for the plan of subdivision application. Administration will report back to the Board as additional information becomes available.

#### MINISTER'S ZONING ORDERS (MZOs and eMZOs)

A MZO is part of Ontario's Planning Act that allows the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing to control how a piece of land is to be used and zoned, with no public consultation or opportunity to appeal by municipalities or other stakeholders such as school boards or citizens. A MZO may restrict or allow certain types of development and replaces any existing official plan and zoning by-law designations by a local

municipality on the parcel of land. Once a MZO is issued by the Province, the landowner is required to fulfil the MZO requirements and is subject to other regional/municipal servicing requirements.

An Enhanced Minister's Zoning Order (eMZO) is similar to a MZO, however when implemented, an eMZO allows the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing to remove municipal use of site plan control and instead require these matters to be dealt with by agreements between landowner(s) and the applicable municipality.

Over the June 2022 - January 2023 reporting period, there have been no residential MZOs or eMZOs granted by the Province in York Region. Administration will continue to monitor the long term accommodation impact of MZOs granted throughout York Region and provide further updates to the Board as required.

#### **SUMMARY**

This report and attached table provides Trustees with a summary of major applications processed by Administration, and reviewed in the context of accommodation needs, during the time period of June 2022 – January 2023. Additional details on various secondary plans and other planning processes that Administration has participated in over the June 2022 – January 2023 timeframe have been included for Trustee review. The next Semi-Annual Development Report will be provided in June 2023.





#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

The intent of this report is to provide the Board with updated NOMINAL enrolment projections based on October 31, 2022 actual enrolment.

Enrolment projections are updated annually in support of many Board decision making processes, including capital planning, program planning, budget development, staffing and Ministry reporting. Planning staff has met with each area Superintendent to review their schools' short and long term projections in detail.

System wide enrolment for 2023-24 is anticipated to decline by 746 students (-1.49%) from the current school year. Enrolment in the elementary panel will experience a continued decline over the next ten years, due in large part to the gap between the graduating Grade 8 cohort being replaced with a smaller incoming JK cohort. Enrolment in the Secondary panel is projected to increase next year then begin to decline over the balance of the 10 year forecast.

Attached as appendices, are tables summarizing 2022 actual enrolment by grade, as well as 10-year enrolment projections.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Enrolment projections are updated annually by Planning Services. Planning staff utilize a number of methodologies, data sources and considerable analysis in the development of a detailed by grade, by school, 10-year enrolment forecast.

Projections are prepared in a "hybrid" model that includes a grade (cohort) survival approach and a number of other data sources to validate and model projected school enrolments.

#### Historical Enrolment

Although past trends do not necessarily repeat themselves, monitoring, analyzing and modeling based on previous enrolment are important elements in the development of projections. One example of this is the annual review of retention rates. Retention rates are the core to the Cohort Survival Method, which forecasts the number of students within schools that move through the grades from one year to the next. Retention rates are annually reviewed and adjusted by school, by grade, by year and by program.

#### Development Data

A variety of data sources are monitored and compiled throughout the calendar year to track development applications and their timing. Municipal development applications for both short and long term residential developments are monitored and tracked throughout the year and represent one of the most vital data inputs in forecasting growth from new development.

Timing of new residential unit closings are estimated based on annual subdivision surveys, historical building permit trends, economic indicators, as well as Regional and Municipal unit forecasts and approvals.

Estimated pupil yields generated by new development are calculated by Planning Services and applied by unit type with consideration to the following variables: housing type, location, community, regional and provincial demographics as well as historical trends.

Planning staff work closely with the regional and local municipalities to maintain an up to date perspective of development and population forecasts and meet regularly throughout the year.

Where there is a lack of formal documentation and timing for long term development trends, such as high density proposals and white-belt expansions, assumptions have been made to ensure projections are consistent with long term regional growth forecasts.

#### **Building Permit and Occupancy Data**

Building permit and occupancy data are tracked to ensure short-term residential growth is accurately recorded.

#### Live Birth Data

Live birth data is analyzed at both a micro and macro level, and currently represents one of the only indicators for forecasting JK enrolment.

#### **VIRTUAL LEARNING (St. Teresa of Calcutta)**

As of October 31, 2022, 295 students were enrolled at St. Teresa of Calcutta.

For the purposes of developing school specific enrolment projections, an assumption has been made that St. Teresa of Calcutta will continue in its current model for the 2023/24 school year.

#### **ENROLMENT PROJECTION OVERVIEW:**

The Board is experiencing long term enrolment decline throughout the Region. As noted in the executive summary, enrolment between the 2022-23 and 2023-24 school years is anticipated to decline by 746 students. Over the next 10 years, enrolment is anticipated to decline by an average of -1.09% annually.

Although overall decline is anticipated, primarily in the Elementary panel, there will be pockets of residential growth that will require student accommodation. Within the Town of East Gwillimbury, Administration has received a capital priority approval for an elementary school in Queensville in response to residential growth.

Administration continues to monitor a number of external factors, including servicing restrictions,

provincial housing targets, interest rates, overall population shifts and immigration patterns. Influences of these factors on overall projected enrolment is anticipated to have a gradual impact over the long term.

The charts below illustrate 5-year historical enrolment as well as a 10-year projection, by panel.

#### **Elementary**

Elementary enrolment is anticipated to decline by 936 students for the 2023/24 school year. This is due in large part to a large grade 8 cohort of 3,846 students being replaced with a projected incoming JK class size of 2,225. The gap between graduating grade 8s and incoming JK's has been increasing over time, and is the primary factor contributing to the Board's enrolment decline over the past 5-10 years and continued decline over the next 10 years.



#### Secondary

Secondary enrolment is anticipated to increase for the 2023-24 school year, with an increase of 190 students projected. Enrolment in the secondary panel is anticipated to peak in 2023-24 at 18,859 students.

Secondary enrolment over the next 10 years is anticipated to decline, with an average decline rate of -0.34%. Projections indicate that Board wide secondary enrolment will peak in the 2023-24 school year and then begin to decline. The longer term decline at the secondary panel is due in part to the smaller grade cohorts working their way through the elementary panel into the secondary panel. Despite the projected decline in grade 8's each year transitioning into Grade 9, the Board continues to see positive growth in the number of students coming to our Board who attended a YRDSB

elementary school. If not for the influx of students from Grade 8 to Grade 9 annually, the overall long term decline at the secondary panel would be more significant.




Table 2. Historical and Projected Nominal Secondary Enrolment

# **Board Total**

Overall enrolment throughout the next 10 years is anticipated to decrease at an average rate of -1.09%. Over the next 5 years, enrolment is projected to decrease, with an annual average rate of -1.70%. From 2028-2032, enrolment is projected to decrease by an annual average rate of -0.47%.




Table 3. Historical and Projected Nominal Enrolment (Board Total)

# SUMMARY:

Enrolment projections continue to play a critical role in funding, budgeting, staffing and capital planning. The enrolment projections contained in this report form the basis for accommodation planning and Ministry reporting throughout the next year.

The 2022-2031 NOMINAL enrolment projections indicate an annual enrolment reduction of -1.34% system-wide. Administration will closely monitor changes in enrolment and revise the Board's short and long term enrolment projections as required.

As illustrated in the enrolment projections, enrolment decline continues to be a challenge for the system and will need to be a consideration in the development of the Long Term Accommodation Plan, which will follow the MYSP.

Additional updates will be provided as part of Administration's annual reporting to the Board.

# Summary of Enrolment Projection Assumptions

## General

- Enrolment projections utilize October 31, 2022 as the base year and estimate future enrolment as of October 31 of each year.
- October 31, 2022 enrolment base is extracted from student data (Maplewood) on November 1, 2021 to reflect the October 31st count date.
- Junior Kindergarten projections are forecasted based on projected age cohorts from York Region, "Live Birth" data by municipality from the Registrar General of Ontario and historical trends.
- Grade 9 Enrolment is based on the previous year's cohort, adjusted by retention rates and open access (estimated largely on historical trends).

# Blessed Chiara Badano / St. Katharine Drexel

• The Stouffville Boundary Review was completed on November 24, 2020. Board approved attendance and program boundaries for Blessed Chiara Badano and St. Katharine Drexel have been incorporated into this year's 10-year projection forecast with an assumed opening for September 2023

# Markham East Boundary Review

- As identified in the Board's Long Term Accommodation Plan, a boundary review in eastern Markham is currently underway. The enrolment projections included in this report do not make any assumptions as to the outcome of the boundary review.
- Adjustments will be made as required following the completion of the boundary review, including any Board approvals.

# French Immersion

• In consultation with the Curriculum and Assessment department, Grade 1 FI projections have been developed using registration data as well as historical trends.

# Secondary Dual & Triple Feeder Schools

- Where an elementary school is considered to be a 'dual' or 'triple' feeder to a secondary school, Grade 8 to 9 retention has been modeled using historical data.
- Any changes to dual feeder status of secondary schools will be modeled into future enrolment projection reporting following Board approval

# **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

On September 23, 2022, the Ministry of Education announced the Tutoring Support Program as a part of the Province's efforts to support learning recovery in response to the Covid-19 pandemic. The maximum project funding of \$2,213,654.62 was expected to expire on December 31, 2022, and has been extended until March 30, 2023. The project funding provided small group tutoring support to students from Kindergarten to Grade 12.

The purpose of the funding was to provide tutoring support programs in literacy and/or numeracy and other foundational learning skills. The funding was to be used to hire tutors to work with students in small groups to support them with their learning needs during the school day and outside school hours (before and after school, evenings and weekends.) The funding enabled YCDSB to partner with community organizations to provide tutoring support to identified students.

Prior to developing the tutoring programs at York Catholic, staff examined a range of research on the effectiveness of tutoring programs in Canada, Great Britain and the United States. The research suggested that hiring certified teachers and paraprofessional staff, such as Educational Assistants, Educational Intervenors, and teacher candidates would lead to success in the classroom. The research confirmed that a successful tutoring program involved regular weekly tutoring, in small groups, with familiar tutors and teachers through structured time aligned with the classroom curriculum.

# **PROJECT ACTIVITIES**

School teams (Administrators, Core Resource teachers, Classroom Teachers and Support Staff) collaborated with parents and guardians to identify students who would benefit from individualized or small-group tutoring support. Current achievement data and individualized education plans guided the tutoring referrals. Parents and guardians also had the opportunity to express their interest in having their child(ren) participate in the tutoring program.

The tutoring programs were based on the following criteria:





- An average group size of 5 students, and group sizes capped at 15 students.
- Tutoring was available during evenings and weekends.
- There was individual tutoring for students who would benefit from more attention, including students with special needs.
- Students were provided with a variety of time slots and formats to meet their needs during the school day or outside of school hours.
- The tutoring programs prioritized math, literacy and other foundational skills.
- The programs were offered in collaboration with community partners, and they supported learning in a trusted environment grounded in language, culture and community norms of the students.

A variety of tutoring delivery models were offered to support as many students as possible. Delivery models addressed student needs and ranged from the following options:

- In-person and remote before and after school tutoring.
- Elementary and secondary tutoring during the instructional day.
- Withdrawal from the class during the school day.
- The tutor was present in the classroom, working alongside the teacher, and with individual or small groups of students.
- Elementary and secondary remote tutoring during the evenings and weekends.
- Elementary Saturday in-person and remote tutoring sessions.
- Secondary after-school registered and drop-in programs.

# Tutors hired were:

- Ontario College of Teachers (OCT qualified) permanent or occasional teachers.
- Educational Assistants (EA) and Educational Intervenors (EI).
- Early Childhood Educators (ECE).
- Teacher Candidates.
- Post-secondary students.
- Other individuals (following all collective agreements, ensuring the vulnerable sector check and appropriate training)

# **ELEMENTARY MODELS OF SUPPORT**

The following models were offered to provide students, parents and families with as many opportunities as possible to access tutoring services. Programs were dependent on available staffing.

# In-Person and Remote Tutoring Before and After the School Day

Tutors offered support in-person or remotely before and/ or after the school day. This included remote tutoring during the evenings and on weekends.

# **Tutoring During the Instructional Day**

Tutors offered support during the instructional day. This included individualized support for students who would benefit from more attention, based on student needs or with small groups of up to 15 students. Tutors worked in the classroom, alongside the teacher or withdrew the students from the classroom.

# Saturday Tutoring - In-Person and Remote

The Continuing Education Department offered in-person and remote tutoring support on Saturdays for students in Grades 1 -8.

The Fall session offered three in-person sites (St. Joan of Arc, Maple, Our Lady Queen of the World - Richmond Hill and St. Joseph, Markham) and launched on Saturday, October 29th, 2022. The program ran for 8 weeks October 29th, 2022- December 17th, 2022 from 9:30 am- 12:00 pm and supported 360 students.

The remote tutoring program launched on Saturday, October 29th and the 8-week program ran until Saturday, December 17th, 2022. Students were offered a morning option from 9:30 am -12:00 pm or an afternoon option from 12:30 pm - 3:00 pm. 419 Elementary students participated in the Fall Saturday remote tutoring program.

The Winter Tutoring program was expanded and offered at seven sites (Father Bressani CHS, St. Joan of Arc CHS, Our Lady Queen of the World CHS, St. Joseph CES Markham, St. Maximilian Kolbe CHS, Notre Dame CES and St. Brigid CES.) The program began on Saturday, January 14, 2023, and concludes on Saturday, March 25, 2023. 795 Elementary students participated in the Winter in-person and remote Saturday tutoring program.

# SECONDARY MODELS OF TUTORING SUPPORT



# **Designated Secondary Tutor Program**

Each secondary school hired a Secondary Designated Tutor to provide literacy or numeracy tutoring to students during the instructional day.

The recommended model was to assign the Secondary Designated Tutor 3 English and/or Math classes during the instructional day. The designated tutor supported up to 15 unique students in each class. The support occurred in the class with the permanent teacher present or on a withdrawal basis.

Another suggested model was establishing drop-in classes in 3 out of 4 periods for the Designated Tutor to work with students from multiple English or Math classes.

The appropriate students for this initiative were identified by the school administration in consultation with teaching staff by reviewing student profiles, current student achievement data and individualized education plans. The program concluded on January 25, 2023.

# **After-School Tutoring Support**

Each secondary school hired teachers to provide after-school tutoring support. Up to 15 students preregistered for classes. There were no class caps for drop-in classes. The table below outlines the number of tutors and the number of students accessing tutoring support.

In addition to the tutoring programs in local schools, the Continuing Education Department offered a virtual Grade 9 Literacy and Numeracy tutoring program option.

The program ran remotely from October 31st to January 23, 2023 (Mondays) and from November 2nd to January 25, 2023 (Wednesdays) from 7:00 to 9:00 pm.


# **TUTORING FEEDBACK**

Feedback on the effectiveness of the program was gathered using Google Form surveys. The survey measured the respondent's satisfaction with the delivery of the tutoring program, and the impact of the program on student learning, achievement, engagement, confidence and attitude. Participants were asked to rate statements using a 5-point rating scale. The response options were:


- 1. Strongly disagree
- 2. Disagree
- 3. Neither agree nor disagree
- 4. Agree
- 5. Strongly agree

Students, parents/guardians, administrators and tutors were invited to participate in the survey. 361 tutors and administrators, 98 parents/ guardians and 173 students completed the survey. The following graphics outline the total number of survey responses (632 responses) to each statement.


Statement 1: I was satisfied with the York Catholic Tutoring program.



Statement 2: The Tutoring program improved student engagement, confidence and/ or attitude.



Statement 3: The Tutoring program improved student learning and achievement.





Overall feedback on the tutoring program, from all stakeholder groups, indicated that tutoring was beneficial and advantageous to students. Tutoring improved student achievement and student confidence in learning.

Students reported that they were better able to understand the material, complete assignments and further develop their learning skills. They indicated that reviewing the material with a tutor enabled them to perform better on assessments and projects. Students valued the small group setting as it allowed a more personalized learning experience.

Parents and guardians reported observable positive changes in their child's academic performance, engagement and confidence. They appreciated the help their child was receiving from professionals who were already familiar with the school and curriculum. Several respondents shared that having the program located in their child's school was particularly beneficial and convenient. It was easy to schedule tutoring sessions, arrange to pick up and coordinate with the teachers and staff involved. Many parents and guardians were thankful for the program and its benefits. Several reported that they did not have the financial resources and connections to access private tutoring services for their children and this provided a much-needed alternative. They also shared that tutoring helped to level the playing field for students who may not have had the same opportunities or resources as their peers. Many respondents shared their frustration and disappointment when the program came to an end. They expressed hope that funding for tutoring would continue in the future.

Teachers, support staff and administrators reported a noticeable increase in student confidence and a positive attitude toward learning as a result of the tutoring efforts. Staff reported that students' positive mindset towards learning encouraged them to persevere through challenges, engage with the material, take risks and ultimately achieve greater academic success. Reading programs such as Lexia, Remediation Plus and Nelson Literacy and the supplementary resources from Nelson's My Math Path were accessed to provide additional support to struggling students. Staff also expressed that the tutoring program benefited many students who would not normally get the additional support. Tutoring staff and administrators, like parents, expressed the desire to continue the tutoring program.

#### **Executive Summary:**

The purpose of this report is to provide the Board of Trustees with information on the St. Luke Alternative School Learning model as well as to provide recommendations focusing on how to better serve students throughout the region and how to save costs associated with the program.

#### **Background Information:**

The Alternative Education program is offered for students who are unable to attend school for a variety of reasons, as well as supporting the Safe Schools initiative of the Ministry of Education. These students may have challenges related to anxiety or social interactions, which make it extremely difficult for them to be successful in a regular school. Alternative education sites are also utilized to service long term suspended students (in excess of 6 days) and our expelled students who, by law, must access their education in a different location.

Secondary School Administrators refer students to the Alternative Education sites for:

- credit deficiencies:
- school avoidance/attendance concerns; and/or,
- behavioral challenges
- social emotional/mental health.

Students are only admitted to Alternative Education once <u>all</u> in-school support has been explored/exhausted. Decisions are made via Student Success Team discussions in consultation with central support and parents/guardians.

Current practice requires that students from all 15 secondary schools in need of an alternative learning environment be transported to Our Lady of Peace Catholic Learning Centre located in Maple. Whilst the practice allows for a centralized use of resources in a rent free space, there are a few challenges that need to be addressed:

- 1. High cost of transporting students from their homes to the Maple location;
- 2. Level of engagement for students who have been pulled out of their communities;
- 3. Long distance traveling for students taking away from the learning experience.

For the 2022-23 academic year, the following provisions have been put in place to allow the school to run efficiently:

## 1) **Staffing:**

- 7 Teachers
  - o 6 classroom teachers
  - o 1 Guidance/Coop teacher
- 1 School Psychologist
- 1.5 Behaviour Resource Support Workers
- 1 Mental Health Worker

Report: Centralized eLearn Program Update 2023 - 2024

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

This report is written to provide an update to the Board of Trustees regarding the expansion of the Centralized eLearn Program, which includes information regarding student access to the OeLC (Ontario eLearning Consortium) course options.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The centralized eLearn program has been a viable option for students since 2010/2011, offering 3 course electives. Twelve years later, we are offering 19 course choices at a total of 30 sections, servicing close to 900 students.

PPM 167 requires that students currently in Grade 9 & 10 must earn at least **two online** learning credits as part of the requirements for an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD), unless they have **opted out** or been **exempted**. Specific needs and requests notwithstanding, students who are interested in taking eLearn are allowed to enroll for 1 eLearn course per semester (total of 2 for the year).

#### THREE OPTIONS TO MEET THE REQUIREMENT:

- 1. Select an eLearn course through myBlueprint.
- 2. Select an eLearn course through the OeLC\* Catholic Consortium.
- 3. Take a Summer School eLearn Course.

Students currently in grade 11 have been granted one eLearn credit by the Ministry of Education for the remote learning experienced in 2020-2021, and will therefore need only **one** online learning credit.

In order to meet the increased need, the centralized eLearn program has been expanded so that students going into grade 11 and 12 next year have 41 course options to choose from through myBlueprint. We plan to run at least 125 sections servicing the needs of 3,750 students.

In many respects, eLearning courses, which are exclusively asynchronous, differ from traditional face-to-face classes in the delivery format only. As is the case with our regular day-school classes, eLearning courses are taught from a distinctly Catholic perspective. Every teacher of an eLearning course is a full-time, qualified teacher with the YCDSB. Teachers use a wide range of digital, collaborative, communication and administrative tools to support student learning in the Virtual Learning Environment.

\*OeLC - The OeLC (Ontario eLearning Consortium) is a grassroots partnership of Ontario school boards that began 2005 and is composed of a collective of boards, each of which has entered into mutual agreement to open their eLearning courses to all students throughout member boards without a course fee.

#### Goals of the Centralized eLearn Program

- To provide students who need flexibility in their schedules the opportunity to tailor their timetable to suit their individual needs
- To allow students access to electives and pathways courses that otherwise might not run in their school due to low enrolment
- To help student's gain important transferable skills, including digital literacy, to support lifelong

- learning and employment opportunities
- Become familiar with a variety of other online digital tools used to enhance the learning experience such as Google Workspace, Screencastify, podcasts, etc.
- Become skilled with D2L Brightspace, which is used by many secondary learning institutions as their eLearn platform.

#### **Implementation Plan**

- Students currently enrolled in grade 11 and 12 will be able to select an eLearn course for next year through myBlueprint during course selection.

  - Click HERE for grade 12 Course Options.
  - Click <u>HERE</u> to access centralized communication that went out to students, parents/guardians and shared with school administration and guidance.
- Elective course options and pathways course options that do not run due to low enrolment can be accessed through guidance via the OeLC Catholic Consortium.

#### SUMMARY:

In aligning the Centralized eLearning program with the requirements of PPM 167, we have expanded course options and have a provision to allow students to access eLearn courses outside of the York Catholic District School Board through the Ontario eLearning Consortium (OeLC).

There are several areas of concern that will be addressed as the course selection and staffing/scheduling process unfolds during the months April to June.

- Supervision of grade 11 and 12 students
- Number of Centralized eLearn classes running compared to the number of students accessing OeLC Consortium offerings
- Enrolment:
  - Number of students requesting eLearning
  - Number of students requesting to Opt Out.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

This report is written to provide an update to the Board of Trustees with regard to the St. Robert Catholic High School Capital Priority Request meeting that was held at St. Robert CHS on Wednesday February 15, 2023.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The purpose of the meeting held at St. Robert on February 15th was to engage prominent local politicians in the YCDSB's request for capital funding to support the replacement of the existing 1,104 pupil place secondary school with a new school of 1,600 pupil places to address enrolment pressures, site access and facility condition.

The meeting was a significant success as it allowed the YCDSB Trustees (Chair Alexander, Vice Chair Iafrate and School Trustee Cotton), Senior board personnel, School leaders, the Markham Fire Chief and City of Markham staffers, to share their concerns with MPP Daisy Wai (MPP Richmond Hill), MPP Logan Kanapathi (MPP Markham-Thornhill) and Mayor Frank Scarpitti (Markham).

The comments and feedback that were provided by these elected officials were very positive and supportive as they expressed a commitment to use the avenues that their respective offices afford, to support the request as detailed in a summary letter presented to them by Chair Alexander, Vice Chair Iafrate and Trustee Cotton. (see Appendix)

#### **SUMMARY**

It is recommended that the YCDSB proceed with the request for School Capital Priority funding with the confidence that the elected officials from the City of Markham and Markham-Thornhill support this endeavor.

Dear Community Partners of St. Robert Catholic High School (CHS),

Thank you very much for visiting St. Robert CHS in Markham today. St. Robert CHS is a special learning community that is a success story for Ontario's public education system. It's a place where many leaders and citizens have been formed.

We are asking for your support to build a new St. Robert CHS building, so this school community can continue to thrive for generations to come. This new St. Robert CHS could adequately serve the growing City of Markham and City of Richmond Hill by providing 1,600 pupil spaces and 49 childcare spaces, all within a bright, modern and efficient building.

There are many reasons why we need to rebuild St. Robert CHS:

- The building needs extensive maintenance work. Sections of the building are more than 55 years old and are expensive to operate. After three additions, the school is still only designed for 1,100 students when the current student population is 1,600.
- The school's utilization rate exceeds 150%, resulting in an enrolment cap and many students in St. Robert's CHS catchment area being redirected to other schools.
- The construction of Highway 407 removed a number of the school's road entrances, creating a traffic situation that our municipal partners have said is dangerous.
- The school's facilities cannot accommodate the students' needs for gym time or even eating lunch in the time we can allot them.

The reconstruction of St. Robert CHS also supports a number of government policy commitments:

- Rebuilding St. Robert CHS will support the rapid population growth and population intensification that is expected under *The Places to Grow* plan.
- Rebuilding St. Robert CHS would contribute to creating "Healthy, liveable and safe communities ... ensuring that necessary infrastructure and public service facilities are or will be available to meet current and projected needs" (PPS policy 1.1.1g).
- Rebuilding St. Robert CHS will provide more child care spaces that families need.

Rebuilding St. Robert CHS benefits everyone in the Markham and Richmond Hill cities, so we hope we can count on you to help champion this project that our great city needs. We will be submitting an application for this project in the next funding round and we will provide you an update at that time. When speaking with the Ministry of Education and the Premier's Office, we would ask that you help emphasize the importance of this project for our community.
