Tax Increase Messaging by Municipalities Chair Crowe stated that King Township had a message in their newsletter as follows: With fiscal responsibility top of mind, the King team presented a blended rate of 3.54 per cent—which includes the Township, York Region and the school boards—and is less than the increased cost of living. We have many things to be proud of in this budget, including significant investments in infrastructure, which will ensure that the quality of life in beautiful King remains great. Chair Crowe stated that the School Board mill rate is set by the province and it was her understanding the Chair's Items increase has been 0% since we lost the right to tax. King Township is implying that they or the school boards have control over the education mill rate. Are other municipalities doing the same thing in their messaging? Chair Crowe asked Communications to report on this topic and look into all nine municipalities, if they are doing the same. This information will be shared via email at a later date. Electric Vehicle Mileage Reimbursement (M. lafrate) **Uber - Add as a Transportation Option (M. lafrate)** These two topics will be referred to the Policy Review Committee to Policy 808 Travel, Meals & Expense Reimbursement accordingly.for possible implementation. Update on AP Program (M. lafrate) Vice-Chair lafrate stated that she received many parent calls regarding the multiplier. Director Scuglia advised that a comprehensive report is being developed with clear direction and clarification by Superintendent Candido. Vice-Chair lafrate noted that the staff report should be clear to indicate that Trustees did not change the multiplier. The report will clearly state that staff is looking at adding four more schools to the AP program. It was stated that no decision has been made because any changes to this program must be presented to the Board of Trustees for approval. The Director confirmed that was correct. Director Scuglia advised that consultation occured with teachers and administrators, as the multiplier is an assessment tool. Parents were not consulted. Specific Statement of Issue

Effective September 2024, school bus transportation will no longer be provided to Holy Cross CA students at several collector points.

Summary of key presentation points:

Concerns of Suspending Bus Routes:

- 1. A physical hazard for child walking along busy HWY/Roads to get to alternate collector point.
- 2. More than one transit bus may need to be taken on certain routes. Winter months and daylight savings mean child could be traveling in the dark and alone to and from school.
- 3. Unpredictability of public transit can lead to being late for school.
- 4. Costs associated with taking public transit may be burdensome to those already financially strained.
- 5. Child may feel anxiety by taking public transportation with strangers.
- 6. Concerns for children who are physically challenged getting on public transit.
- 7. Fixed schedules of public transit may not align with individual travel plans.
- 8. Children walking long distances to get to school not sustainable for Canadian winters.
- 9. No consultation with parents on cancelling bus routes.
- 10. No instructions provided to parents as to how our child is to get to school.

Reinstate bus routes.

Specific Statement of Issue

The Student Transportation Services Policy currently only provides bussing for to French Immersion students, but not students enrolled in IB or AP Secondary Schools who reside outside of the regular track boundary of the IB or AP designated schools. The current Policy Section 3.6.4 details the current Policy for Optional Programs and 3.6.4.2 details services specifically calling out French Immersion students. This is an inequity in the system, as our xxx was direct to the IB program at Cardinal Carter, which is xx home school for this Optional Program. We reside over 2.1km away from the closest public transit and our 14 year old xxx would be required to walk through a forested park, by xxx for the majority of this walk to public transit.

Summary of key presentation points:

- 1) Our home on xx is only accessible by motor vehicle coming off of Dufferin Street.
- 2) There are no YRT buses (or any public transit) that either run through our neighbourhood or even on Dufferin

Street! The closest bus station to our home is located at Keele/Vista Gate - > 2.1km walking distance from our home.

- 3) A Google Map inquiry for YRT CCCHS to our home is total of 1hr and 7 minutes that includes a 20min walk through a forested park that is inhabited with at least one pack of coyotes. Our xx is the only student that would be making this walk alone.
- 4) The current policy is inequitable to students in IB & AP Optional Programs vs French Immersion students defined in Section 3.6.4 of the Student Transportation Services Policy.
- 5) Cardinal Carter is the catch basin school for IB students from SRA.
- 6) Our xx was directed by xx educators to pursue the IB programme at CCCHS, as it is an ideal fit for xxx strengths in STEM & International Languages.
- 7) YRCDSB buses are running through our neighbourhood to CCCHS through 2027 so no new bus routes required, xx can simply take the established bus routes already running daily.

If Applicable, your key recommendations/suggestions to address the problem/issue:

All students that are in Optional Programs such as IB and AP, should be treated equally per the YRCDSB Student Transportation Services Policy.

Sections 3.6.4 in its entirety should be amended to include all students in Optional Programs such as IB and AP.

On an exceptional basis, our xxx should be permitted to take the current buses running from our neighbourhood to CCCHS, due to the extenuating circumstances identified above.

Summary of key presentation points:

- we understand the need to unify our communities in difficult times, especially as tensions across and towards a number of communities continues to rise.
- Flags, their colours and their composition are symbols that have deep meaning for many communities.
- restricting the ability of students and staff to seek permission to fly a flag, and restricting what can be displayed inside a school is an unreasonable restriction on free speech.

My name is Christina Nobili I live in the jurisdiction for my xxx to attend to Holy Cross.

I have enrolled xx into Holy Cross as this is the feeder school and the school that my xxx has chosen.

When I did in enroll xxx the expectation was a school bus would be picking xx up and dropping xx off. We had a plan in place each and everyday. I was thrown a curve ball when I found out the bus route would be cancelled (not confirmed or denied) the coming year when xx would be joining her first year of grade 9 September 2024.

This has been a very difficult and challenging time for my xx and myself for reasons stated below.

We live on xxx road. Main intersection is Pine Valley and Hwy 7. As you may or may not know that intersection is a very dangerous intersection.

In order for my xxx to get to and from school each and every day xx would need to take 3 public transits bus routes which at the age of 13/14 is completely and incredibly dangerous for her. Public transit would have to be from Pine York & Pine Valley to Hwy 7 then cross Hwy 7 to catch the Hwy 7 and Pine valley bus to Hwy 7 and Martingrove bus, then vice versa to return home. That is a total of 3 buses in order for xx to arrive at school and return home. In order for xxx to ensure xx makes it both ways would she would need to leave xx home by 7am most likely earlier. During the winter season it's still dark at that time and unacceptable for a child to be walking alone.

Hwy 7 is extremely dangerous as many, many, many accidents have happened over the years and is one of the worst intersections in Vaughan.

I'm a single working mom that my hours will not allow for me to drive xx or pick xx up. It would be another financial hardship for me to provide as well on top of it being extremely dangerous for a 13/14 year old to endure.

This decision in the making has caused nothing but anxiety to both my xx and I. We tried to come up with multiple different alternatives and came up with absolutely nothing.

Getting rid of the school bus transportation will cause dire consequences and a decision to change to another school where xx will safely arrive and return home each and everyday.

A simple decision to eliminate busses without consulting with the community has caused nothing but extreme hardship to my family and many other families.

I myself have attended holy cross many years ago including my 2 sisters which we were provided school bus transportation each way and made for attendance and to return home safely. It was extremely efficient and beneficial to my sisters, parents and I. I urge you all to please reconsider all options before cancelling bus routes to and from Holy Cross.

This has put myself and many families in very hard and dire circumstances that can be simply avoided.

As a parent, public transportation is not an option, it is extremely dangerous and completely unnecessary for a child to do each day and very worrisome..

Specific Statement of Issue

Policy #203 Student Transportation Services - barriers and limitation to equal access for secondary school students attending regional programs including French Immersion (FI) and Advanced Placement (AP)

Summary of key presentation points:

My xxx is currently attending grade nine at Father Bressani CHS where xx is enrolled in both the FI and AP streams. My xxx's home school is St. Jean de Brebeuf which does not offer access to regional programs my xxx is enrolled in. I would much prefer that my xxx had access to same programs at our local school, however, as this option is unavailable the definition of what constitutes 'home school' (3.3) is unfair to students enrolled in regional programs and ought to be revisited and updated. Since Bressani is the school that my xxx is attending and Bressani is located more than 4.8 km from our residence, my xxx should have access to school transportation.

Our family lives in xxx area. According to the current policy, our area is 'transit served' (5.11) which means that my xxx must rely on public transportation to get to, and from school. The policy fails to recognize, however, that YRT service in Vaughan is generally not reliable, especially along smaller city streets, and that Vaughan is not a pedestrian friendly and pedestrian safe city. Getting to and from Father Bressani CHS using public transportation is very difficult and dangerous. The school is located away from regional street and serviced by public transit, which is infrequent, unreliable and overall poor, even during school hours. In fact, a designated school route bus to Father Bressani is only available in the afternoon. One is not available in the mornings. Students travelling from xxx rely on two connecting busses, must cross a very busy intersection to wait for a connecting bus and must walk another 10 minutes to school from a bus stop where they are dropped off. For the first couple of months of the school year, a pedestrian button was missing, and pedestrian signal was not working. My xxx was crossing a four-lane intersection/regional street for months to get to a connecting bus while endangering xx life. On several occasions, xxx also missed xx connecting bus because the first bust was running late and xx was required to walk to school for another 40 min along a very busy road as alternate bus service is unavailable. I urge the Committee to revisit the 'transit served' description, and ensure safety of students using public transit be paramount when revisiting transportation policy.

Interestingly, secondary students residing in Sanoma Heights fall withing the definition of 'transit-served', and yet, all YCDSB secondary students are eligible to receive school bus transportation to a high school of their choice. This is yet another example of how the current policy is not applied fairly to students and discriminates against students based on their area of residence.

Another limitation and inequality of the current policy is that it offers school transportation to PACE students and not AP students despite that fact that both are enrolled in courses with the exact curriculum. A school bus for PACE students makes a stop 3min from our house, yet my xxx is unable to access this mode of transportation and is required to take public transit instead.

Lastly, the policy does not acknowledge the need for secondary students pursuing French Immersion program to be considered by this policy. Framework for French as Second Language in Ontario Schools: A Call to Action, Goal 2, calls for Increased the percentage of students studying FSL until graduation) (pg. 18). The Committee ought to consider this provincial call for action and integrate mechanism into the transportation policy to address this call to action.

YCDSB's strategic core values clearly outline the board commitment to be inclusive, equitable and accessible to all its students. Similarly, the board's strategic commitment lists continued improvement of student achievement and engaging communities. I believe that these commitments clearly outline YCDSB's vision and commitment and that the current transportation policy is not line with and directly hinders these values and commitments. I urge the Committee to ensure the updated policy is equitable and inclusive to all students and does not pose barriers to student's education.

If Applicable, your key recommendations/suggestions to address the problem/issue:

- 1. Provide equitable access to transportation to AP students attending Father Bressani CHS that will be in line with transportation available to PACE students, as both groups of students are enrolled in the same curriculum.
- 2. Ensure updated definition of what 'transit served' means in the City of Vaughan and consider student safety to be paramount component of this definition. Consider limitations of public transit to access schools not located directly on major regional roads.
- 3. Review Student Transportation Policy against Framework for French as Second Language in Ontario Schools. A Call for Action.
- 4. Review policy parameters and ensure they are equitable, inclusive and eliminates barriers to student education as per current policy.
- 5. Engage with students and parents to seek input on changes to Student Transportation Policy
- 6. Engage grade 8 students and parents considering enrollment in FI regional secondary program in to increase engagement and awareness of program and transportation needs to support FSL program.
- 7. Ensure policy is applied equitably and equally to YCDSB students.
