6. DIRECTOR'S REPORT/UPDATES

The end of another school year is a few weeks away and I am sure you are looking forward to spending some time with family and friends this summer. This is a joyful and busy time as our schools prepare for exams, graduation ceremonies, end of the year barbeques, excursions, concerts, and report cards -- to name a few.

We have much to celebrate this year and I would like to highlight some of our recent accomplishments at the board office and in our schools.

Multi-Year Strategic Planning

As you know, we launched our Multi-Year Strategic Plan in October with a new mission and vision statement, as well as, core values and strategic commitments for the next three years. Our strategic commitments are the: *Integration of Catholic Faith*, *Continuous Improvement of Student Achievement*, *Effective Use of Our Resources and Engaging*

Our Communities. We have established action teams who are busy working on developing goals and initiatives for these commitments; and we will be rolling out our goals in the fall.

Our Multi-Year Strategic Plan is built upon our past and reflects what we have heard from our stakeholders. The largest stakeholder respondent group was parents, with a response rate of 42%. I thank our parent community for their input, as it was very instrumental in shaping our Multi-Year Strategic Plan.

Long Term Accommodation Plan

In March, the Board of Trustees approved the Board's Long Term Accommodation Plan for 2015-2020, which focuses on addressing changing demographics in our school communities. Recent provincial announcements have highlighted the need for school boards across the province to reduce surplus capacity through the implementation of a Long Term Accommodation Plan. This planning report looks at the current and future student accommodation needs. Implementation of the plan will begin in the fall 2015.

Each accommodation review will include opportunities for community and parent participation, and we will keep all stakeholders informed throughout the process.

Admissions: Summer Registration for Elementary School

Last year, our Board's Admissions Office accepted new student registrations throughout the summer and this was very successful. This year, we will be taking elementary school registrations for the 2015-2016 school year between July 2nd, and August 27th. Social Justice/Charity Initiatives: Nepal Fundraiser/ShareLife

Our YCDSB schools have been busy with fundraising collections for ShareLife and the Nepal Humanitarian Relief. I am very pleased to report that to date, our schools have collected \$35,469.11 (thirty-five thousand, four hundred and sixty nine dollars) for ShareLife.

Equally as impressive, our schools collected a total of \$67,685.94 (sixty-seven thousand, six hundred and eighty five dollars) for the Nepal Humanitarian Relief efforts. These funds are being sent to the Archdiocese of Toronto, and they will be sending the funds through the official global Catholic relief agency, Caritas.

The Catholic Social Teachings of Justice and Charity are alive in our school communities! I thank all of our parents, for their support in making this an exceptional year.

Catholic Education Week

May 3rd to 8th was Catholic Education Week across the province, and all of our schools organized wonderful events and activities. School Superintendents and trustees shared great feedback with me after attending special liturgies, spring concerts, theatrical productions, and more. Some of our schools celebrated milestone anniversaries during Catholic Education Week and I wish to congratulate those schools – St. Padre Pio CES (10th Anniversary), St. John Bosco CES (25th Anniversary) and St. Marguerite d'Youville CES (10th Anniversary). St Joseph Markham celebrated its official opening and blessing as well during Catholic Education Week. Father John Kelly CES celebrated its 25th Anniversary just a few weeks ago, and we celebrated the solemn blessing and official opening of Guardian Angels CES on May 27th.
