

Transition to School Summer Program

Purpose:

To assist young students in preparing for the transition from summer holidays back to school routines

To focus not only on literacy and numeracy skills but to also allow for some socialization

To offer a chance for parents to see and use some strategies that they could then utilize at home when working with their children

To offer parents daily workshops to assist them with dealing with the many facets of ASD and how ASD may impact their children



Transition to School Summer Program

Program was held at St. Mary Immaculate School August 15 – 26, 2016

Open to students in YCDSB who were in JK to grade 2 as of June 2016



Transition to School Summer Program

- Program accommodated 20 students and their parents
- Three teachers, CYW student volunteer and secondary school student volunteers supporting program
- · Presentations by community agencies and board staff



Transition to School Summer Program

Budget included:

- Family Literacy and Numeracy Program to cover the cost of the two teachers' salaries
- \$500.00 budget from Autism Ontario for supplies and consumables



Comments from parents

- Program was very beneficial.
- The program helped my child transition back to school by having them practice school routines and appropriate classroom behavior. The program assisted my child with functioning in both small and large groups, as well as different environments within the school.
- Program got my son back into a schedule and a routine. He's also more aware that school will be starting very soon so hopefully there will be less anxiety when the day finally arrives
- The presenters were amazing! At every topic there was at least one point that would really open my eyes and have me see and think about things differently
- The staff were amazing. Friendly and kind yet professional and knowledgeable.
 Also recognized my child's strengths and needs.

YCDSB Assistive Technology Summer Camp Updates (2016):

Focus

The focus of the camp was on assistive technology accommodations and strategies that are available to any YCDSB student.

Location

The YCDSB Google Summer Camp took place at the YCDSB Catholic Education Centre (320 Bloomington Road West, Aurora ON L4G 0M1). It occupied two learning centres/ computer labs. Initially, students and parents came together each morning/afternoon for review and group activities and then the two groups were divided, allowing parallel content to be delivered in a way that was more meaningful to each group.

Parent/Student Participants

A total of 68 parents and 72 students attended YCDSB's AT Summer Camp in 2016.

Students

- were introduced to the Google Platform and its various apps and extensions while reviewing steps for safe log-in and logout
- utilized Google Drive, Read&Write for Google Chrome, Mindomo, and Google Slides to create a cumulative project that they presented to their parents on the final day of camp.
- practiced file management skills while organizing their Google Drive.
- gained proficiency with prediction spelling support and an auditory self-editing strategy to aid in the writing process
- learned to customize their Read&Write settings to best meet their learning needs
- explored the use of Read&Write for Google within Google Documents, when reading PDF documents and when reading website. Accommodations for researching, reading and completing worksheets were explored.
- developed brainstorming skills when using Mindomo (a graphic organizer app) to plan their project
- expanded their knowledge of Google Slides as an effective presentation device for school projects and assignments.
- further developed their social skills while participating in group and collaborative activities
- Advocated for themselves when they required support through troubleshooting

Parents

- were introduced to the Google Platform, apps and extensions, log-in/ logout procedures
- reviewed the importance of file management skills including organizing files in the Google Drive, creating folders, uploading/downloading, and file sharing
- explored and customized the Read&Write settings while reading articles about student learning styles and digital citizenship.

- learned specific strategies such as auditory self-editing, efficient document searching strategies, vocabulary building, and collecting highlights to support research and studying
- experimented with the main features of Read&Write for Google Chrome and Mindomo and reflected on how these tools best accommodate their children's learning needs
- learned how paper documents/resources can easily be converted into accessible electronic text and then accessed on various platforms: computers, Chromebooks, and iPads
- explored the SEA resource website as a source of news, resources, and "how-to" videos on everything pertaining to Google Apps for Education

Feedback

Feedback from both parents and students was very positive, and that this was the best summer AT camp they have ever attended.

Parents indicated a high chance of returning and that they would recommend the experience to other parents.

Parent Feedback

"The AT trainer did an excellent job in reviewing the material. She gave me an overview of the basics that will allow me to support my daughter in the coming year."

"Good informative camp, I had never seen the programs before. This has greatly increased my knowledge for use of these programs."

"I totally enjoyed every minute and appreciate all the valuable information that we have learned!"

"I really liked how the second and third day of camp started off with a review of the material covered so far. Using a game to cover this material was also a great idea as it motivated the children to participate."

"I really liked our instructor, she is very patient and knowledgable. She really knows how to explain the material well."

Student Feedback

The students demonstrated their learning by using Read&Write for Google to complete student feedback forms.

Students rated the camp overall as: good or great

A random sampling of 10% of student feedback forms was taken. 100% of randomly selected student feedback forms indicated that the student:

- Will now be more confident and ready for school next year
- learned something really helpful at camp
- and would attend camp again if they had the chance

The students particularly enjoyed preparing and presenting a Google Slide project, and working with Mindomo (visual mind-mapping software).

Dear SEAC Chair,

I am writing to you today in my capacity as the Chair of SEAC for the Renfrew County Catholic District School Board. As you may be aware, PPM 156 'Supporting Transitions for Students with Special Needs' came into effect on September 2, 2014. During the course of the 2014 - 2015 and the 2015 – 2016 school year our SEAC had been looking at the issue of transitions and we paid particular attention to the transition out of secondary school and employment prospects for our students with disabilities. During this time of discussion and research we have discovered the following:

- The Federal Government of Canada has the Employment Equity Act that identifies persons with disabilities as a designated group; and
- The Government of Ontario has an Employment Equity Act whereby it is recognized that people with disabilities experience higher rates of unemployment; and
- According to Statistics Canada, in 2011 the employment rate of Canadians aged 25 – 64 with disabilities was 49%, compared with 79% for Canadians without a disability; and
- The employment rate among persons aged 25 64
 with a mild disability was 68%, compared with 54%
 of those with a moderate disability, 42% of persons
 with a severe disability and 26% among those with
 a very severe disability; and
- Some jurisdictions, such as the United States of America have established disability hiring goals, whereby any contractors bidding on federal contracts would need to demonstrate that they have established a goal of 7% of their workforce being disabled;

We invite you as Chair of your SEAC to bring this letter forward to your table and share this data. At RCCDSB we have brought this information forward to our Trustees and
