Catholic Education Week

Catholic Education Week was a huge success as we demonstrated how publicly-funded Catholic education enriches the lives of young people. One of the highlights of the week was the province-wide Mass, which was celebrated at the Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King in Hamilton and was live-streamed in classrooms across Ontario. All our elementary and secondary schools took part in Catholic Education Week activities.

Yes, I Can Awards

The Yes, I Can Awards were held Thursday, May 22 at Cardinal Carter CHS. The Council for Exceptional Children Chapter 543 applauded children with exceptionalities from the York Catholic District School Board and the York Region District School Board, as well as the adults who help them thrive. This is always a very special event for the YCDSB.

YCDSB Special Olympics

Our Lady Queen of the World Catholic Academy will host a very meaningful event on Thursday, May 29, 2025 - The YCDSB Secondary Special Olympics Track and Field meet. Every year, students with exceptionalities come together to participate in a fun day of sport as the YCDSB community cheers them on.

Luke 4:18 Symposium

Catholic education is at its best when we help young people put their faith into action. Every day, YCDSB students, staff and family members roll up their sleeves to make the world a better place, just as Jesus called us to do. To recognize some of the life-changing work done by the YCDSB's Luke 4:18 clubs, on Friday, May 30, there will be a symposium for student leaders at the CEC. More than 250 students from 50 schools will be in attendance, with secondary students leading various social justice breakout sessions during the day.

The Sacred Heart of Jesus

In the Catholic calendar, June is the Month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus has a special place in the York Catholic District School Board (YCDSB). Last year, the Board of Trustees passed a motion proclaiming that June is devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus in all YCDSB schools. At that time, we gratefully accepted framed portraits of the Sacred Heart of Jesus from local Knights of Columbus chapters from throughout York Region. These portraits are now displayed in all of our schools and in the Catholic Education Centre.

Those who attended these sessions have learned a great deal, and we are thankful to the YCPIC for putting them together. 6.0 CHAIR'S REPORT/UPDATE - Chair Martina Saverino

Martina: No official report

YCPIC Chair Martina Saverino summarized the YCPIC events that had taken place so far this year and reminded everyone of the last event taking place on Saturday, May 31, 2025 and noted the low attendance.

10.0 DISCUSSION/INFORMATION ITEMS(S):

a) 2025-2026 YCPIC Meeting Dates: J. De Faveri

A list of the YCPIC meeting dates for 2025-2026 were provided.

b) 2024-2025 Mileage Reimbursement: J. De Faveri

Mileage reimbursement (\$0.72 per km) will be provided to YCPIC members who attended YCPIC meetings in person, as per *Policy 808 Travel, Meals and Expense Reimbursement*. Reimbursement cheques will be mailed out during the month of July. YCPIC members will be sent an email by S. Greco with details.

c) Committee Member Participation in YCPIC Activities: R. De Cicco

R. De Cicco addressed the in person and virtual members asking for barriers to participate in the YCPIC engagement events? Robyn highlighted that only the executive members organized and participated and it was unfortunate, especially for those that voted for particular topics not to attend and show support. Robyn then asked why the YCPIC committee members couldn't or wouldn't attend and what recommendations do they have to draw in more engagement from the communities as well as how are they representing YCPIC at their respective schools to advertise and promote these events?

- a) Genevieve responded that she suspects the location may be a bit of a challenge.
- b) Jaclyn asked members of YCPIC to go back to their council and find out what's keeping them from attending.
- c) Martina responded that this also includes the YCPIC members and meeting attendance as well as desire for more committee commitment. She requested that each YCPIC member go back and ask their council and their school communities and share their thoughts as well so we are hearing from all the school communities.

d) Policy 220 Graduation Exercises in Elementary & Secondary Schools:

Genevieve raised community questions and concerns regarding the changes to naming awards and locations of graduations. The community is very concerned and it is upsetting that the efforts of students not acknowledged but other awards still exist like athletics etc. She shared knowledge of surveys and petitions now being circulated on these topics in the communities. Jennifer Sarna thanked Genevieve for bringing this forward and advised that there is a misconception about changes brought forward for approval on March 6th 2024. There was a Policy Review Committee Meeting, and they did speak to a lot of it and decided not to make any changes and will exist as it is on the website now as well as last year. There is no plan to move locations or force locations etc. as well as no restriction on honor roll. Policy as it stands. No change until March of 2028.

e) Follow up on Absence Dropdown Menu: Martina Saverino

YCPIC Chair Martina Saverino requested an update on her request to amend absence selections for students. Director De Faveri advised that the inquiry regarding the hover option is not a function that the IT Department can support at this time. They currently have no technical capacity. Two conversations with staff over the category with illness and stomach or respiratory has to remain as is as per Public Health requirement. Data is said to not be used for analytic purposes and we are not sure what that means around privacy issues. Therefore, we will have to keep the status quo.

f) YCPIC Repository Update: Jaclyn Toma

The Compass was introduced last meeting as a potential name for a repository that houses shared ideas around hot lunch, parent engagement and fund raising. There was a pause on delivering the survey until proper protocols and compliance were met. We can't use the name "Compass" as that name is already used for something else in the Board. Policy update – submitted the policy request form to Associate Director Sarna to see if we can get the surveys ready for September to share with CSC in September .

New motion put forward to vote on new repository name. "Council Connect Hub" received 6 total votes and the remainder votes were for alternative options that didn't receive more than 6 votes. Lastly Jaclyn reshared the intention of sharing successful ideas and resources to assist the councils seeking ideas that have worked or not worked to help in the efforts at other schools.

11.0 ADJOURNMENT – Martina Saverino

YCPIC Chair Martina Saverino asked if there were any questions before she brought the meeting to an end.

Olufisayo B. asked about renewing the YCPIC commitment and S. Greco advised it would all be done in the fall of 2025.

Sarah T. welcomed more parent members to join the Religious Education Advisory Committee as they are looking for members. Martina S. advised her to connect with S. Greco so that she can share the details with the entire committee.

Genevieve S. advised that getting a position on council is competitive and if you are not on council but are on a two year term for YCPIC then can you still remain part of YCPIC. Martina S. advised that this will be taken away for confirmation and someone will share the findings.

YCPIC Chair Martina Saverino thanked all the YCPIC members on a one-year term for their commitment, and bid farewell until September, to those on a two-year term.

YCPIC Chair Martina Saverino adjourned the meeting at 7:43 PM
