THE MANDATE/ROLE OF SEAC

The Special Education Advisory Committee of the York Catholic District School Board was established, in accordance with the Education Act, to make recommendations to the Board with respect to any matter affecting the establishment and development of special education programs and services for students with exceptional needs.

Some of the areas of focus are philosophy and goals, program delivery systems, services and facilities, policies and procedures, funding, annual review of Special Educational Plan, interaction with other Board committees in related areas and any other matters concerning special education as determined by the committee or requested by the Board.

The role of SEAC will ensure that the Board is aware and keeps pace with changing community and professional views and concerns.

MEMBERSHIP OF SEAC

The composition of SEAC is outlined in the Education Act and is composed of three school trustees; one representative from each of the local parent associations, not to exceed 12, in the area of jurisdiction of the Board, as nominated by the local association and appointed by the Board. The Board may appoint additional members at large who are not representative of the above and are not members of the Board or on a committee of the Board.

SEAC members are available as a resource for students with exceptional needs, parents/guardians of such students, schools, educators, trustees and the community.
