The York Catholic District School Board (YCDSB) enjoyed a tremendous year together - together in the classroom, together at school events and together in the celebration of our faith. This year the YCDSB had the opportunity to catch up on many important celebrations that were missed during the pandemic, including eight Milestone Anniversaries for schools that opened 10, 25 or 50 years ago. The Catholic Education Week theme was particularly timely: "We Are Many. We Are One." It was an important reminder that the beautiful diversity of our YCDSB community is best celebrated when we are together.

During this school year, the Board of Trustees said goodbye to four retiring Trustees and thanked them for their service: Rose Cantisano, Dino Giulliani, Maria Marchese and Dominic Mazzotta. The Board also welcomed four new members of the team: Michaela Barbieri, Joseph DiMeo, Angela Grella and Angela Saggese.

Integration of Our Catholic Faith

Catholics are called to live the Gospel mission through faith and good works for others. The YCDSB takes this mission very seriously. Here are just a few of the many ways that the YCDSB lived our faith this school year:

- · Bishop Boissonneau celebrated our first-ever Board-wide Lenten Mass, which was live-streamed into every classroom in the YCDSB.
- Dushani Selvakumar from Father Michael McGivney CA was named Catholic Teacher of the Year by the Catholic Teachers' Guild of Toronto.
- All YCDSB schools supported ShareLife and 23 of the top 50 fundraising schools in the Archdiocese of Toronto come from the YCDSB.
- The Board received the Terry Fox Milestone Award for raising \$4.5 million for cancer research since we began fundraising for the Terry Fox Foundation.
- · With the help of YCPIC and other community partners, backpacks were purchased and filled with school supplies for Ukrainian students who joined the YCDSB after fleeing from their war-ravaged country.

Continuous Improvement of Student Achievement

The YCDSB continued to be a provincial leader in academic achievement. We are very proud of all our students and staff for constantly striving to do their very best as they work toward achieving their Catholic School Graduate Expectations.

- The YCDSB continued to outperform provincial averages in all categories of the EQAO and the OSSLT.
- Graduation rates continued to increase and remain among the highest in Ontario with 97.5% of YCDSB students graduating secondary school in five years.
- There was an excellent response to the pandemic literacy catch-up tutoring support program with 9,902 YCDSB students receiving some extra help in this school year alone.
- Interest in the STREAM Centres of Excellence continued to grow with 525 elementary classes visiting a STREAM Centre in 2022-2023 alone.

Effective Use of Our Resources

Budgets are challenging for school boards across the province and the YCDSB is committed to using every dollar to its fullest potential. Prudent resource management enables the YCDSB to provide the best education possible for our students, and successes in this area include:

- The YCDSB produced a new Multi-Year Strategic Plan that will guide us into 2028.
- We renewed collective agreements with CUPE Locals 1571, 2331, 2331-02 and 5476
- There was an almost 40 per cent increase in budget survey responses in 2023 over 2022.
- A task force was created to help staff manage absenteeism in order to improve well-being and alleviate cost pressures.

Engaging Our Communities

Collaborating with students, families, staff, parishes and community partners is central to the work of the YCDSB. It is through an ongoing conversation between parents and the YCDSB that we can ensure that student needs are being met.

- The YCDSB's Twitter account surpassed 35,000 followers and the YCDSB launched an Instagram account
- We have continued our tradition of Exit Surveys for those moving onto secondary school or graduating from secondary school; administered another round of School Climate Survey; administered our first-ever Mental Health survey for students and staff.
- We celebrated the accomplishments of six YCDSB Distinguished Alumni who have made amazing contributions to our world: Andi Petrillo, Andrew Nembhard, Daniele Rossi, Jim Anderson, John Calarco and Maria-Rosa La Neve.
- A fresh new website frontpage was designed and it will be implemented this summer.
